Your Business May Be Eligible for a Work Opportunity Tax Credit

The Galion-Crestline Area Chamber of Commerce and the Crawford Partnership would like to spread awareness about the Work Opportunity Tax Credit (WOTC) Program that is available to employers of current Crawford County residents.

- The program has been re-authorized through December 31, 2019.
- One-time credit for new hires.
- The *Designated Community Resident (DCR)* target group provides a credit to employers that hire individuals between the ages of 18-39 who reside in a *Rural Renewal County (RRC)*.
- *Five RRC's* in Ohio: *Crawford, Monroe, Paulding, Seneca and Van Wert.*
- An eligible DCR can receive a maximum credit amount of *\$2,400 per new hire.*
- Ohio has an automated system that makes applying for the credit very easy.
- Applications must be submitted to the Ohio WOTC office within *28 calendar days.*

Basically, this WOTC is available to any business, large or small, that has hired a new employee who is between the ages of 18 and 39 and is a current resident of Crawford County. They must work at least 120 hours and at 400 hours the federal tax credit can be maximized at \$2,400. Note: applications must be submitted to the Ohio WOTC Office within 28 days of the start to work date to meet the timely filing criteria. **Don't miss this tax credit by missing the deadline!**
